

Youth Racing Eligibility Requirements

In order for a youth to race in a senior division certain requirements must be satisfied in order to obtain certification to compete in said division. For example if a 13 year old was to seek approval to race in the Youth Hornet Division which is a 14-17 year old class, or a 15 year old was to seek approval to race in the Pure Stock class, etc. which is a 16 or older class, the individual must obtain certification from the Track Management and the track insurance company to do so.

Here is a list of those requirements:

- 1. Compose written letter of request explaining why the driver desires to race in this class.**
- 2. A signed letter of consent from the driver's legal parent or guardian.**
- 3. Give a list of racing history (resume) that would make the driver qualified to compete in the senior division of his/her request.**
- 4. Obtain multiple letters of recommendation from individuals that have been witness to the drivers racing ability and support the request for certification.**
- 5. The driver will be asked to demonstrate, at Yakima Speedway, his/her driving ability in a racecar that meets the classification of the division in which they are applying for certification. The judging panel could be composed of Yakima Speedway Management, Yakima Speedway Race Director and racing peers of the senior level. The driving test could be held on an open practice date, private practice, or on a specified race day. Test day will need to be scheduled through Yakima Speedway Management.**

These requirements are that of both the track insurance company and Yakima Speedway Management and are in the name of safety and good competition. Yakima Speedway Management highly encourages the involvement of young people in racing to help develop the next generations of the racing community.
